

Here are some details of the communication between the Deputy Commissioner (DC/ District Collector/District Magistrate) of Leh Mr MK Dwivedi and the NGOs network called Ladakh Voluntary Network (LVN) in the past one year. *We have added our comments in red.*

The letters are true typed copies of the originals which we have in our possession and can be sent if needed.

After Mr. Dwivedi came to Leh in March 2006 as District Collector/Deputy Commissioner (DC), this was the very first communication/'ORDER' to NGOs, that was circulated by him on 4th April 2006. This was just a day after the Conference on 3rd April on Youth & Employment organised by the District Industries Department. In this conference while saying that youth should go for private entrepreneurship and not be limited to government jobs alone, Sonam Wangchuk made a passing reference saying that in government jobs people live on tax payers money whether it is a Chief Secretary, DC or a small peon. Apparently this offended the DC and hence:

OFFICE OF THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER, LEH

O R D E R

Intelligence reports have been received from various sources that a large number of non - governmental organization operating in Leh are violating fiscal and administrative norms. The funds are being received by these organization and are not being utilized in the public interest or for the purpose for which these fund have been assigned. There is no transparency and accountability. Hence it is hereby ordered that all non governmental organization/Semi government organization who received any resources from public or government or religious and charitable organization or societies/registered bodies or any other sources shall have to submit detail of their organization including the details of person directly or indirectly associated with the organization, to Deputy Commissioner Office latest by 31st of May, 2006. Beside this all these organization have to submit a monthly report to Deputy Commissioner Office about their activities and the funds/ resources received by these organization. It is enjoined upon all such organizations that in case the government official are directly or indirectly associated with these organization their details have to be submitted separately to this office without fail.

If compliance as desired above is not forthcoming, raids shall be conducted on the registered offices of these organizations seizing all their documents and assets and matter shall be taken up with the concerned Ministries/funding Institutions besides de-recognizing the existence of such organizations.

Such organizations include religious charitable educational cultural and other Non-governmental and semi governmental organizations.

Dear Sir,

1. This is in response to your order No DC- (NGO) 06 (0704), dated 4,04,2006 regarding the above subject. The Ladakh Voluntary Network (LVN) appreciates your concern for transparency and accountability in the NGO sector, however we would also like to convey that we take strong objection to the way in which such information was demanded, particularly to wordings like 'raids will be conducted.' As such we are submitting all the details of our organisations under protest, to the CEC Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council, Leh..
2. NGOs in Ladakh have been known for their dynamism and dedication throughout the state and the country. While we don't expect honours and rewards, we also don't appreciate such sweeping generalised accusations. Measures like circulating harshly worded orders and making unreasonable demands like monthly activities reports etc. are not only demoralising, but also unheard of in NGO circles across the country.
3. Sir, NGOs are a vital part of a dynamic democratic civil society and we value our freedom, at the same time we also abide by all the set norms and channels of the government which are already in place to monitor our activities. Like in other parts of the country all NGOs here are registered under the Societies Registration Act (1941) and some with the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (1973). All NGOs get their accounts audited annually through reputed registered accounting firms and those receiving foreign contribution submit their audited financial statements to the Ministry of Home Affairs under the FCRA act. Further the Special Bureau of the Home ministry also locally monitors the activities of these organisations.
4. In the light of the above, the members of the LVN have collectively decided not to comply with the above order as a matter of principle. However since we highly value the idea of transparency and accountability, we shall be submitting all details of the member organisations of LVN to the Chief Executive Councillor, LAHDC for records and for coordination of activities, as this is the elected representative body of the people here. **In case you desire any information you are welcome to share it from the office of the CEC.**
5. Further, in case your step is sincerely aimed at ensuring transparency and accountability, we propose to move ahead in the same spirit. Both NGOs and government departments together could start a system of open Social-Audit as is done in many states, where each department/NGO presents details of their activities and finances before the general public on a certain day.
6. Regarding the demand for monthly reports of activities of all NGOs, LVN finds it neither reasonable nor practically possible. If the district administration thinks this

is possible and desirable then we would like the administration to collect such reports from its line departments first. We would also request that such reports be kindly shared with the NGO community.

It is to bring to your notice that the Non- Political Certificate issued by this office vide file No. DML-1 (V_97 (903) dated 30/04/1997 to NGO namely 'Rural Development and You' has been withdrawn and the said NGO has been blacklisted. It has been reported that the said NGO is still organizing public activities.

In this regard, you are requested to keep a close watch on the activities of said NGO and its Director Shri Padma Tashi and not allow any public activities to the NGO.

This and several other threatening letters were sent to the LVN chair and his organisation Rural Development & You (RDY) after the DC received the above letter. When Mr Padma Tashi met the DC and asked why, he says the DC told 'Its all because of your beautiful signature my dear' .

Mahabodi charged of illegal occupation of land

After this another highly reputed NGO the Mahabodi International Meditation Centre (MIMC) received a letter from the DC saying that they were illegally occupying state land and action will be initiated against them. Again when asked why the DC told the President of the organisation 'Your NGO's name was on top of the list of signatories to that letter'. This account was given to Sonam Wangchuk personally by MIMC President Ven Sanghasena. However since they later patched up with the DC, we are not able to have a copy of this letter.

Police FIR lodged against LEHO for damage of a dam in floods

Then in August yet another well known NGO Ladakh Environment and Health Organisation LEHO learnt that an FIR had been lodged against them by the DC himself, for the breakage of a check dam during the heavy floods in Leh in August 2006. It is interesting to note that so many roads and bridges broke in the same flood and the dam was built by the community under the Watershed Scheme and enhanced funds for the dam was released by the same administration, which lodged the FIR.

Government Employees asked to submit affidavits

There were also other unheard of orders against the NGOs, such as a circular asking all government employees to submit an affidavit stating that they have no connections whatsoever with any NGO. Even in Kashmir valley, employees have not been asked for affidavits stating that they have no relations with any militant outfits. Surely for all the work they have done NGOs in Ladakh did not deserve this.

Three round of deliberation were held by Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir with representative of some NGOs working in Leh (As per list enclosed) from 22nd to 24th August 2006. The concluding meeting was also attended by Deputy Commissioner/CEO, LAHDC, Leh.

The following decision were taken:-

1. There is need for increased in cooperation/ collaboration and interaction between the Government Agencies and NGOs working in Leh so as to deliver maximum benefit from the Government and Non Government! Programme being implemented by NGOs. To achieve this, a suitable mechanism shall be worked out by Deputy Commissioner/CEO, LAHDC, Leh in consultation with the representatives of NGOs
2. Taking note of the initiative taken by NGOs to introduce social audit and present their accounts, Policies Programme activities and achievement before the public periodically in the shape of exhibitions. Similar information can be shared by them with the district administration on the formats to be decided mutually.
3. The communication and the orders issued from April 2006 onward till date shall be kept in abeyance, and withdrawn by the DC/CEO, LAHDC Leh. NGOs shall also withdraw the communications issued by them under intimation to the authorities to whom this were addressed and endorsed.
4. Representatives of t he NGO offered to withdraw the petition filed by them before the Hon'ble Court.

Finally after many appeals, the State government sent Mr Basharat Ahmad Dhar the Divisional Commissioner Kashmir to Leh to find a solution to the problem. In a final meeting where both the DC and the NGOs sat together the above agreement was reached and signed by all. However six months passed and the DC did not withdraw his letters, stating finally that the matter was in court and therefore it would not be proper to do so. On 14th February 2007 in an interim communication even the court said that it would not come in the way if the DC were to withdraw his communications. But so far the DC has refused to act on this too.

In the recent past there has been following serious allegations against you and your NGO:-

1. You have been demoralising Government staff, by-passing administrative offices like Zonal Education Office etc., using undignified language and remarks, showering baseless allegations against department and its functionaries.
2. You have been illegally occupying 200 Kanals of land without paying dues to the Government.
3. You have been misusing provisions of Foreign Contribution Act by misappropriation of funds received from Foreign Contributions.
4. You have been anti national connections in China and other places, which have been or may be exploited for anti national activities.
5. You have been threatening Council and District Administration from time to time with adverse remarks and with threat of dire consequences there by destabilizing the harmony of the place.

All these allegations are very serious and hold significant threat to the administration and peace of the region.

A Notice in hereby served against you for initiating action in all these matters against your NGO and in particular you in personal capacity so as to take preventive safety measure to prevent any disturbance in the region.

Finally recently when SECMOL was having some differences with the Hill Council government the DC and his advisors saw their opportunity to attack SECMOL who they had always seen as the main leader in the Network. The DC sent this notice with strong allegations. This letter contradicts with the following letter that was also written and received on the same day. In the second show cause notice he gives us 15 days to explain our position on the 'illegal occupation of land' where as in the first one he asks police to initiate necessary action. This is obviously in violation of principles of natural justice.

Subject: **Notice.**

Ground survey has been conducted, and it has been found that you are under illegal occupation of 200 Kanals of state land at Phey. You have been occupying this land illegally for more than 12 years. Now hereby you are served upon a notice to immediately deposit the premium of the land into Government Treasury, failing which suitable action shall be taken against you for encroachment of state land and loss to government exchequer. The prevailing rates as intimated by revenue authorities, Leh are Rs.40,000/- (Rupees thirty five thousand only **this mistake and others are there in the letters, it seems they wrote these in a great hurry**) per Kanal. Hence and amount of Rs.80.00 lacs (Rupees eighty lacs only) should be deposited into the Government Treasury within a month's time without fail.

If you have anything to say in this matter you have to appear personally before Deputy Commissioner (Revenue Court of Collector, Leh) within 15 days time, failing which it shall be understood that you have nothing to say in this matter and the dues shall be recovered from you under provision of law of the land.

Based on these allegations the Leh Police lodged an FIR. Seeing that the DC intends to arrest him, Sonam Wangchuk quickly wrote him back a letter explaining our position. Simultaneously for the village people who we work for and who can not read and write we also brought out a video film that clarified SECMOL's position and explained the background of DC's charges. In the film we also said that if we are victimised in this manner and if the people of Ladakh do not need the services of SECMOL, then we would withdraw from all education collaborations with the government.

Sub: Unfounded accusations against SECMOL

Sir,

With reference to your letter dated 28/02/07, ref no: DC/NGO/06(704/15)' please note the following:

In reply to Para 1. We vehemently deny this allegation. We have always carried out our activities in consultation with appropriate level in the education department. In the light of your previous actions, it is evident that you are plotting a case against yet another NGO, simply for taking a stand against your highhandedness.

In reply to Para 2. We have officially applied for the land at Phey and it is still under process just as is the case with many other NGOs and private owners. In all these years no official or DC has raised this as an issue, in fact we have partnered with the Hill Council to hold trainings at this Campus for roughly 1,000 teachers, 3,500 VEC leaders, 500 Panchayat leaders and 2,000 youths.

In reply to Para 3. We have always kept our accounts up to date as per FCRA regulations. We have also answered all queries that we have received from the FCRA Division of Home Ministry. Therefore we find your allegation wild and baseless.

In reply to Para 4. This is a most outrageous allegation and clearly indicates that you are concocting yet another ridiculous plot against an LVN (Ladakh Voluntary Network) member. I have no connections whatsoever in China except that I took my mother for a pilgrimage to Lhasa six years ago. If a pilgrimage makes one antinational then so many others including some of our top leaders have also visited Lhasa. Since this is a serious allegation I would like you to prove it, otherwise I will be compelled to approach the court of law for a case of character assassination.

In reply to Para 5. This is yet another example of misuse of your position to threaten NGOs. We have only made appeals and never threats. By misinterpreting this freedom of opinion as a threat to peace and harmony it is you who is trying to misuse your powers for settling personal scores.

It is very clear that you are playing a mischievous game. Your habit of baselessly accusing NGOs seems to be crossing every boundary. There is no substance whatsoever in any of your allegations except personal vendetta.

I will therefore, hold you personally responsible for any consequences of this notice and will exercise my freedom to approach the court of law.

ORDER

Whereas a large number of incidences one after the other have been initiated by Mr. Sonam Wangchuk, Chief functionary of a NGO named SECMOL, which have created large dissatisfaction and disturbance among teaching community of Education Department and has highly de-motivated lot of Government officials law fully employed to serve the Education Department;

Whereas through their representation on 24th February, 2007 the Staff of Educaiton department and through teacher association the employees of the department have very gravely resented interference of the said person and the NGO;

Whereas day to day humiliation is being faced by large number of Government employees in effecting their duties due to provocative propaganda by the said person and staff or his NGO;

Whereas recently the said person and other staff of his NGO have started organizing public meetings in Villages and Schools of District Leh disseminating provocative and maligning propaganda against the department, administration, council and state government;

Whereas very recently SECMOL has started anti establishment propoganda on a very large scale by circulating and displaying VCDs under their name with content which are highly provocative and have a potential of disturbing the public tranquility;

Whereas this may result into likelihood of clash between various groups, VECs Government Employees etc. and is creating annoyance and injury to a large section of the society;

Whereas threat to human lives, the safety and disturbances of public tranquility and creation law and order problem is being apprehended;

Whereas letter NO:ALTA/242-07 dated: 08.03.2007 from Secretary ALTA stating the situation and the letter NO: Secmol/22753-55 dated: 08.03.2007 of Chief Education Officer, Leh addressed to Deputy Commissioner, Leh and the letter signed by Mr. Sonam Wangchuk on behalf of all staff of SECMOL regarding circulation the VCD along with the CD seized from various places is evidence to the rising of a difficult situation in Leh provoked by Mr. Sonam Wangchuk;

Whereas it has been found that there are sufficient grounds for proceeding under Section, 144 of Code of Criminal procedure, 1989 (1933 AD)

Hence, with the power vested in me, U/S Sec 144, CRPC, 1 M. K. Dwivedi, IAS District Magistrate, Leh hereby order a complete ban on circulation of such materials like audio/video CDs/ Cassette, written text, pamphlet/ books/ brochures/ letters etc. by Mr. Sonam Wangchuk or any staff/ worker of NGO SECMOL. Further, the ban is imposed to restrict all public meetings, speeches, gatherings, direct or indirect propaganda by the said person, SECMOL NGO or any person associated with them within the entire jurisdiction of district Leh.

After the Video film reached the people in the villages, the Village Education Committees (VECs), started writing to the administration and giving news releases on the Radio Leh condemning the DC for labelling SECMOL as anti-national and appealing SECMOL not to close down its educational programmes. Shaken by this the DC arranged for some disgruntled teachers and officers (who have always opposed the reforms) to write complaints and then imposed Section 144, CRPC (the riot act that is normally used to control serious communal riots etc.) thereby banning all 'propaganda materials', letters, CDs, public speeches etc. from SECMOL. Our office watchman was even arrested for violating it, following which there were street protests in Leh by villagers and student members. Again Section 144 was used to stop them from protesting even. Strangely the use of Section 144 was not even proclaimed on any media and people did not even know that they were violating it. Lawyers say that normally duration of Sec 144 is mentioned in the order but here it is going on like an indefinite martial law. It is important to mention that the video film which was in Ladakhi language was absolutely peaceful (we are making a subtitled version), police officers were themselves seen wondering why this film was called provocative.

LAHDC, Leh for his anti-establishment propoganda of the Education Department, the undersigned deems it proper that Education Department, ceases all its links with the SECMOL and shall not support the organization in future for carrying out any Educational activity by the organization. Hence it is enjoined upon all the official of the teaching / non-teaching faculties of this department not to participate directly or indirectly in any of the activities of the organization that shall have a bearing on the working of the Department. The Education Department is not responsible for involvement of any person of the department in the unlawful activities organized by the above said organization.

I appeal to all the officers/officials of the Department to dedicated their lives in the service of society by way of raising the standard of Education and improve the quality of Education in collaboration with VECs ensuring community participation in schools and not be swept away by any false propoganda.
